

Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)

Illinois statute 5 ILCS 140/4 requires each public body to post specific information regarding the public body as part of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

The Will County treasurer serves as both treasurer and collector. The treasurer is responsible for depositing, investing, and disbursing all funds for Will County. The collector is responsible for billing, collecting, investing and distributing Will County property taxes. The duties of treasurer and collector are regulated by Illinois state statutes.

The functional areas of the office of the Will County treasurer are Accounting, Banking, and Taxes.

The FY 2010 operating budget for the Will County treasurer is \$1,677,818.

The treasurer has 20 full-time employees.

Requests for information and public records

The treasurer accepts requests to inspect or copy records via U.S. mail, courier, email, personal delivery, and fax. The request does not need to be submitted on a standard form; however, a standard form is available. A request may be anonymous.
